Creation of the Belgian Federation for Infant and Young Child Nutrition: launch of babynutrition.be

Brussels, 25 September 2018 – DSM, Hero, Inex, Mead Johnson Nutrition, Nestlé and Nutricia announce that together, they establish the Belgian Federation for Infant and Young Child Nutrition, referred to as "babynutrition.be". The newly created industry association represents food business operators putting foods and food ingredients which are specifically tailored for infants and young children aged 0-3 years old on the Belgian market.

By creating babynutrition.be, the six food companies join forces in this newly created industry association to cover topics related to the following categories: infant formulae, follow-on-formulae, processed cereal-based products, baby foods, infant foods for special medical purposes and "growing-up milk". By doing so, the Belgian Federation for Infant and Young Child Nutrition acts as a spokesperson towards relevant stakeholders, engaging in a pro-active dialogue with them.

Priorities

An optimal nutrition in the early childhood is essential for growth, health and development of infants and young children.

babynutrition.be supports the principles of the World Health Organisation and advice from Belgian childhood associations such as <u>ONE</u>, Office de la Naissance et de l'Enfance, and <u>Kind en Gezin</u>, that breastfeeding provides the best source of nutrition for a baby.

The baby food sector is one of the most strictly regulated sectors in Europe, with legislation covering food safety, nutritional composition, labelling and advertising, among other areas. European and national legislation currently lays down rules for infant formulae, follow-on-formulae, processed cereal-based products, baby foods, foods for special medical purposes and "growing-up milk".

The Belgian Federation for Infant and Young Child Nutrition focusses on:

- informing its members about the current applicable regulatory framework and on-going developments;
- exchanging knowledge with policy makers.
